## Parma Parade and Fireworks Highlight City's Fourth of July Celebration

Fireworks begin at dusk. In case of rain, a fireworks only show is scheduled for the following evening, July 5<sup>th</sup>. The "rainout" program is also scheduled to begin at dusk.
